WHEN: Sunday, October 31 from 2:00 pm until 4:30 pm

WHERE: in the lower parking lot at church

HOW:

Altars/ofrenda—set up and decorate a traditional Dia de los Muertos altar

Cars/autos – decorate your car

Costume/ la disfraz-- dress in the tradition of your homeland or wear your Halloween costume

Candy/dulce – bring wrapped candy to distribute to children and the young at heart

Saints/santos – dress as your patron Saint or bring an image or statue to display

Music/música – volunteer to play an instrument or sing a traditional hymn or song for the day

Talk/conversacion – tell your fellow parishioners about your tradition of memorializing and about the special people you are remembering this year

You can choose to participate in as many of these activities as you wish. You can spend as much time as you wish. The celebration will be outdoors and we recommend everyone wear a mask.
